Your MRI Scan

What is a MRI Scan?

Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) is a method of obtaining pictures of the tissues and organs within the body. The scanner uses a combination of a powerful magnet, radio-frequency waves and a sophisticated computer. Do I have to have this scan?

The doctor has requested this scan for you. It is the easiest way to gain the information needed to diagnose your problem.

Are there any risks involved?

The Radiographer will run through a simple safety check with you to make sure you can be scanned.

A MRI scan is not suitable for everyone. Before booking, please read the safety information below and ring us if you have a query.

It is important that you ring us if any of the following applies to you:

- **Pregnancy**
- **Heart Pacemaker**
- **Aneurysm clips in your head**
- **Any metal implants (other than dental work)**
- **Accidents involving metal splinters in your eye, head or body**
- **Surgery within the past 3 months**



Your MRI Scan

Weight Limit

There is a weight limit of 200kg (31 stone) for the MRI scanner. Please ring for further advice if you think you may be too heavy.

What do I have to do before I come?

- You may eat and drink normally.
- You should continue with your usual medication.
- You will be asked to remove all metal objects such as watch, coins and credit cards. This is because of the strong magnetic field in the scanner.
- **You will not be asked to remove your wedding ring.**
- Please remove all other jewellery and body piercing ornaments and leave them at home.
- Eye make-up can contain metal particles, so this should not be worn.
- If you are able to wear loose clothing without metal fastenings, you will not need to change. Don't worry if you have nothing suitable – we can provide a gown.

What does a MRI Scan involve?

- You will need to keep still whilst the scan is taking place.
- The scanner does make a drumming noise, but ear protection is provided. You should not experience any discomfort
- We can play music from your own CD if you wish.



Your MRI Scan

- Sometimes it is necessary to have a small injection to enhance the images. If so, we will discuss this with you first.

What happens after the Scan?

- The Radiologist will study the images and report on them.
- The report will be sent directly to your referring doctor.
- You will receive a letter or follow-up appointment to discuss the results, please allow up to one month for this.
