INSPIRING

People often get started volunteering through seeing someone else doing it or because they themselves have benefitted from being helped. You could inspire your friends, a neighbour or even a patient to volunteer by sharing your experiences.

We ask all of our volunteers to be reliable, willing to help, with a good sense of humour and a cheerful disposition.

Useful skills to have, or to want to develop, are the ability to chat and listen to people and be able to speak up if something's wrong.
